DECISION DOCUMENT

on co-funding of Slovenian - Japanese joint projects in FY 2011 (April 1, 2011 – March 31, 2013)

Based on the Memorandum of Understanding on Scientific Cooperation between the Ministry of Education, Science and Sport the Republic of Slovenia and the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science signed in April 2001 and on the call for proposals for joint research projects and joint seminars, published by the Slovenian Research Agency and the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science respectively in 2010, the two sides realize that:

The Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Technology of the Republic of Slovenia received 12 (twelve) proposals for joint research projects and the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science received 13 (thirteen) proposals for joint research projects.

Based on the results of the evaluation of the project proposals received by both sides The Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Technology of the Republic of Slovenia and the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science have come to an agreement that according to the peer review screening they will jointly fund the following joint research projects in the FY 2011 (April 1, 2011 – March 31, 2013):
